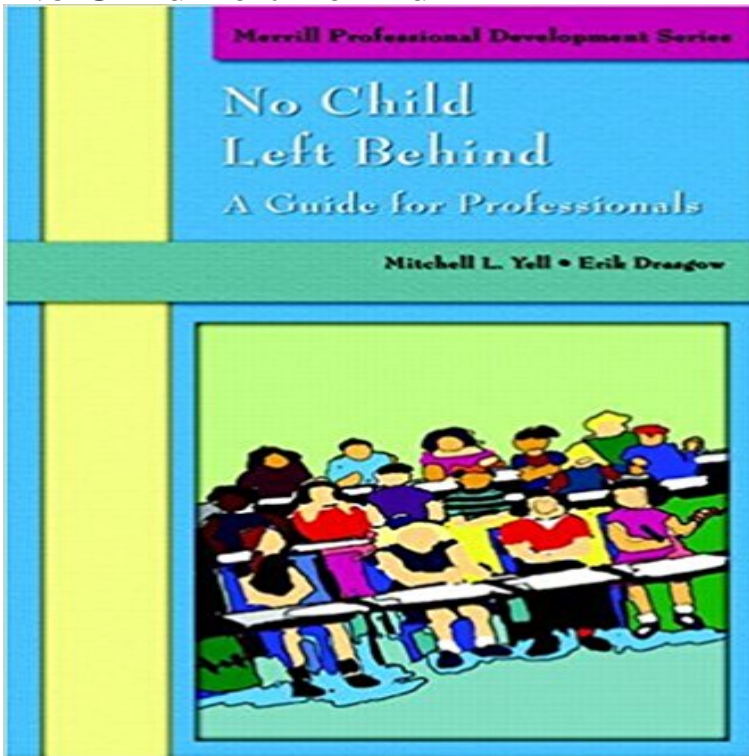


No Child Left Behind
